Adds a shortcut to Windows "Alt-F" keystroke to all macros. This doesn't do anything except add the keystroke to macros, nothing else. It just adds the "Alt-F" keystroke to macros. The actual function of the "Alt-F" key is still managed by the OS, therefore you will still need to press the ALT key or use a shortcut on your keyboard in order to activate the function. The shortcut is placed below the description of the macro, so if you accidentally start typing the macro you are still able to see the shortcut. How To Use: To add this shortcut to any macros you have already created, simply click on the Macros tab, scroll down to the macro and edit the shortcut. Simply type in the shortcut and then click "Add". You may have to scroll down a bit to find the tab, since some macros have multiple tabs. After adding the shortcut to the macros, it will be available in the Macros tab, and you may have to reload the page in order to see the shortcut. Also if you accidentally start typing the shortcut, you won't see anything until you have typed the shortcut, and then it will appear. How To Disable: If you want to turn this shortcut off completely, simply open up the Macros tab and edit the shortcut. Simply uncheck the box next to "Show Shortcut" and click on the "Update" button. To turn this shortcut off permanently, simply go to Settings -> Keyboard -> Shortcuts -> Macro -> "Custom" and durn off the shortcut to the "Custom" section.
